DO YOU CALL HER BLESSED?

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of our Blessed Mother into heaven. This Feast was defined by Pope Pius XII on 1st November, 1950 to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her life on earth, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory" This is so because Mary was conceived without original sin, she didn't participate in the sin of Adam and Eve. Thus, she was prepared from the onset to be the tabernacle of God. Be that as it may, if Mary was conceived without original sin and she bore the Saviour in her womb, it is taken for granted that God couldn't have allowed her body to decay in the earth. Simply put, this feast tells us that after the earthly life of our Blessed Mother Mary, she was taken up to heaven body and soul. An article of faith!!! As we celebrate this feast, we all are reminded that at the end we shall assume to heaven like Mary and therefore we are called upon to imitate her virtues of humility, obedience, compassion, love and above all purity of mind and heart so as to be with her in the kingdom of God. Again, Mary says "Yes, from this day forward all generations will come me blessed". So, fortunate are we who call her blessed. The best way to call her blessed and to honour her is to pray our ROSARY daily. The Rosary grants us peace of mind; unites us more with Jesus and Mary and more so, draws down the abundant mercies of God. **QUEEN ASSUMED INTO HEAVEN...PRAY FOR US. I wish you a happy Sunday.**
