ENTER THROUGH THE NARROW GATE

The gate of eternal life is open to everyone as the Lord says "I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory" (Isaiah 66:18). That is to say that, the kingdom of God is not meant for a particular nation or people and Jesus corroborates this by saying that "men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God" (LK 13:29). Who are these people someone might ask, just as someone asked Jesus in the Gospel of today. Instead of answering this question Jesus advises "Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed" (LK 13:24). So, Jesus is saying that the door to eternal life is very narrow and as such if you wish to go through you must discipline yourself. Discipline is not easy. It is always painful and involves suffering to discipline oneself. But don't be discouraged for the book of Hebrews encourages us "My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves, and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons" (Heb. 12:5-6). Therefore, for you to go through a narrow door you must shed enough weight of greed, selfishness, gluttony and lust and also reduce the height of pride, envy and anger so as to go in through the narrow door. Let's take the advice of Christ seriously and begin now to enter through the narrow door before the door is closed.
