BE ASTUTE IN THE THINGS OF GOD

In today's Gospel, Luke 16:1-13, Jesus says that "the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light" Put in other words, the children of this world use what they have to get what they want. We can see that clearly in the first reading where the rich swindle the poor by "lowering the bushel, raising the shekel, by swindling and tampering with the scales" so as to buy up the poor for money. So also, in the Gospel this shrewd servant was praised by his master not because of his dishonesty but because of his astuteness. His astuteness made him to think and plan for the future. He insured his future by doing favours to others.

We all are called upon to learn something from the attitude of this shrewd servant. We are not supposed to cheat or be dishonest as this servant, but we are expected to plan for the future as he did and our future as Christians is eternal life. Have you thought and planned for the future? How would that be done? Jesus gives us the answer, he says "use money, as tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity" (Lk 16:9). That is to say, use your money to help the poor and needy for, the pocket of the poor is a safe box for the rich. Secondly Jesus advises us to use our gifts and talents wisely. See money and wealth as a means and not an end. Jesus says "If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches?" (Lk 16:11). **BE ASTUTE IN THE THINGS OF GOD. I wish you a blessed Sunday!!!**
