THE RIGHT ATTITUDE BEFORE GOD

If you listen to the prayer of this Pharisee in the Gospel of today, you can agree with me that this man wasn't a bad person. In fact, he was a very honest and dedicated person. All he said about himself actually was true. He was not grasping, unjust; not adulterous like the rest of mankind, he fasts twice a week and pays his tithe. Again, all he said about the tax collector was true because a tax collector was known as a thief. So, he was absolutely right in all he said but unfortunately, the Bible says that the tax collector went home at rights with God than the Pharisee because he stood at a distance and prayed "God, be merciful to me, a sinner" The question today is why did the Pharisee leave the presence of God unsatisfied?

1. He went to God with the wrong attitude. The attitude of self-righteousness which is called spiritual pride.
2. He thought his good deeds could merit him salvation. "Our upright deeds are like filthy rags before God" (Isaiah 64:6).
3. He wasted his time talking about the sin of the other instead of his.

So, we are encouraged to go before God with the right attitude as this tax collector did. Though Jesus did not praise him for his sins but commended him for his humility. Let us understand that we are not perfect, we sin in one or the other and therefore our salvation does not lie on our good deeds but gratuitously. Let us shun pride and embrace humility for Jesus says that "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted" I wish you a lovely Sunday!!!
