THE WAY OF THE CROSS IS THE WAY OF SALVATION

I remember Jesus saying, "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Mk 8:34). In another place He says, "Your perseverance will win you your lives" (Lk 21:19). This simply means that one has to carry his/her cross and follow Jesus every day in order to make eternal life. To carry the cross is not always easy, it is often times painful and discouraging. However, it is through the way of the cross that our salvation is assured.

In the Gospel of this second Sunday of Lent, Jesus took with Him three of His disciples up to the mountain where He got transfigured. He did this for them to experience and have a glimpse of the glory of God. It was too beautiful to behold which led Peter to exclaim "Rabbi, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah" (Mk 9:5). Peter didn't want to go back again after experiencing this heavenly glory. He wanted to stay forever because the kingdom of God is holy and beautiful. Unfortunately, Jesus did not grant him his request because they must go through the way of the cross before experiencing this heavenly glory.

So, the message of this second Sunday of Lent is for you to carry your cross, no matter how painful, just like Abraham did and he received his blessings. Thus, as you carry your cross with faith remember that God is with you, you are not alone. Little wonder St Paul asks, "With God on our side who can be against us?" (Rom. 8:31). So, do not be afraid, do not lose your faith, carry your cross and follow Christ. Bear this in mind, "Your perseverance will win you your lives". I pray with Peter that "through your faith, God's power will guard you until the salvation which has been prepared is revealed at the end of time" (1 Pt 1:5) Amen. I wish you a holy and spirit filled Lenten season.
