DIE TO SELF AND YIELD RICH HARVEST!!! Dear Friends, it is the 5th Sunday of Lent. We are gradually getting to the Easter festivities. I hope you are doing well with your Lenten observances? I would want us to reflect on this word of our Lord Jesus Christ that "unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if dies, it yields a rich harvest" (Jn 12:24). Christ is simply saving that something in us has to die for us to be fruitful and productive as Christians. This means we have to yield up the love of life for the sake of life of love. Thus, He says "Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life" (Jn 12:25). Interestingly, Jesus teaches by example. He sacrificed Himself on the cross in order to give life to humanity and so He wants us to do the same by sacrificing our lives to give life to other people. Therefore, it is not what we take up but what we give up that makes us and others rich.

Be that as it may, we are called upon this 5th Sunday of Lent to die off our self-will and yield a rich harvest of God's will. Above all, to die off that spirit of unforgiveness and resentment and yield a rich harvest of forgiveness and tolerance. It is never easy to sacrifice something in us to better the lives of other people. Jesus, Himself passed through excruciating pains in order to give life to others. So, don't give up as a result of difficulty or pains when you are sacrificing one thing or the other for the sake of others. Mother Teresa once said, "A sacrifice to be real must cost, must hurt, must empty ourselves". So, die to self and yield a rich harvest!!! I wish you a holy and spirit filled Lenten season. FR BEDE
