

Jesus sends out 72 of His disciples in pairs to go to the towns and villages where He was to visit. The number 72 symbolically represents the universality of the Gospel of Christ. Jesus wants the Gospel to reach every part of the world and so, every baptised Christian belongs to this 72 for the propagation of the Gospel. Nobody is left out! Take note, He sent them out in pairs. This simply means that there is no individual Christian. We are created to complement each other. Christians who speak in the name of Christ must be in communion with others and not act independently of them. Therefore, we all are called upon to propagate the Gospel. Meanwhile, Jesus encourages them to pray for more labourers in the vineyard for the harvest is plenty but labourers are few. In this harvest there are many hungry people who need labourers to feed them; there are many rough sleepers that need labourers to shelter them; there are many people who have not heard the Gospel that need labourers who will preach to them; there are many in this harvest who are wallowing in sin and immorality and they need labourers who will encourage them to repent of their sinful ways; there are many in this harvest who are being marginalised and oppressed and they need labourers who will grant them freedom and justice. While asking them to pray for labourers, Jesus sends them to go and bring peace to all people of the world and prepare them for His coming. So, you pray and work. This mission is very urgent! We all need to go out and spread good news of peace and reconciliation; heal the sick and let them know that the kingdom of God is close at hand. To prove the urgency of this mission, Jesus says to them carry no haversack and greet no one on the road, this shows that this mission is a very serious one. However, peace cannot be achieved without opposition. Little wonder Jesus says "I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves" (Lk 10:3). We should not be afraid of opposition in propagating the Gospel of Christ. Interestingly, the disciples went and came back with great joy. They were rejoicing as they gave account of their work to their Master because the devil submitted to them. In other words, they carried out their work successfully as their Master instructed. Now, Jesus told them you don't rejoice be-

cause the devil submitted to you but rejoice because your names are written in heaven. So, if you would want your name to be written in heaven, try to be part of those who bring good news of peace to the world. Make sure your name is written in heaven!!! This should be our priority. I wish you a blessed Sunday!!!






