GOD IS WITH US!!!

It is Christmas once again! A Saviour is born to us!! We celebrate with great joy and thanksgiving. Christmas is all about the celebration of the fulfilment of God's promise to humanity. He is a God who never disappoints. Once He promises, it must surely come to pass. Hence, God says through the mouth of His Prophet Ezekiel that "There will be no further delay in the fulfilling of any my words, What I have said shall be done now" (Ezk 12:28). He promises "Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as King and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land...and this is the name by which he will be called: The Lord is our righteousness" (Jer 23:5-6). Further, He promises "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Emmanuel" (Isaiah 7:14). This promise was fulfilled at Christmas, when God came into the world as a little Baby through the womb of a virgin. Thus, a Saviour is born to us, who is called Emmanuel, which means God with us. Paul attests in the second reading that he was "set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, concerning his son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be the son of God" (Rm 1:3). So, as we celebrate the fulfilment of God's promise at Christmas, we have to appreciate those who allowed themselves to be used by God in order to fulfil His promise. We appreciate John who was the forerunner of Christ. He announced His coming to people and urged the people to prepare His way and make His paths straight. Again, we say thank you to our Blessed Mother, who notwithstanding in her state of confusion was able to say yes to God and allowed God to come to the world through her. More so, we appreciate Joseph so much. It might seem simple but not easy to take responsibility of a woman who he never impregnated, but he listened to the voice of God and obeyed God's commands however difficult. As we celebrate with joy that God is with us, can we allow ourselves this season for God to use us to touch the lives of other people. Just like John, Joseph and Mother Mary allowed God to use them, may we allow God to touch the lives of other people through us this Christmas. I wish you a merry Christas.




