Today's Gospel shows Jesus fulfilling what was said through the prophet Isaiah: "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light." Our first reading expands this prophecy about the "land west of the Jordan," detailing how the Lord will glorify this area and the people in it. "You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing," Isaiah says. "For the yoke that burdened them, the pole on their shoulder, and the rod of their taskmaster you have smashed..." The Gospel indicates that Jesus Christ simply arriving in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali begins to fulfil this prophecy. Therefore, we learn that Jesus' presence—His dwelling among us—is already a "great light" in a land of gloom. When we sit in our pews during Mass, we can reflect on Christ's presence and how His desire to dwell in our hearts through the Holy Eucharist is already cause for "abundant joy and great rejoicing." Further, Jesus brings the promised freedom "from the rod of the taskmaster" through His preaching and His call. Rather than liberating Israel from Roman occupation, which many of the Jews expected, Jesus frees His people from the greater bondage of sin—from the taskmaster of their own broken selves. Christ calls His listeners to "repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." This exhortation to walk away from one's sin is an invitation to the holiness for which mankind was created. When we burdened people seek to follow Jesus, He smashes all yokes, poles, and rods that weigh us down and separate us from Him.

the light of Christ

His call. They *immediately* left behind what they were doing and followed Him. Join me in praying for their intercession today, that we might see the freedom and joy that Jesus offers and follow Him without hesitation.

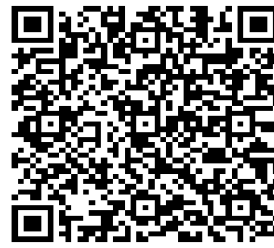
